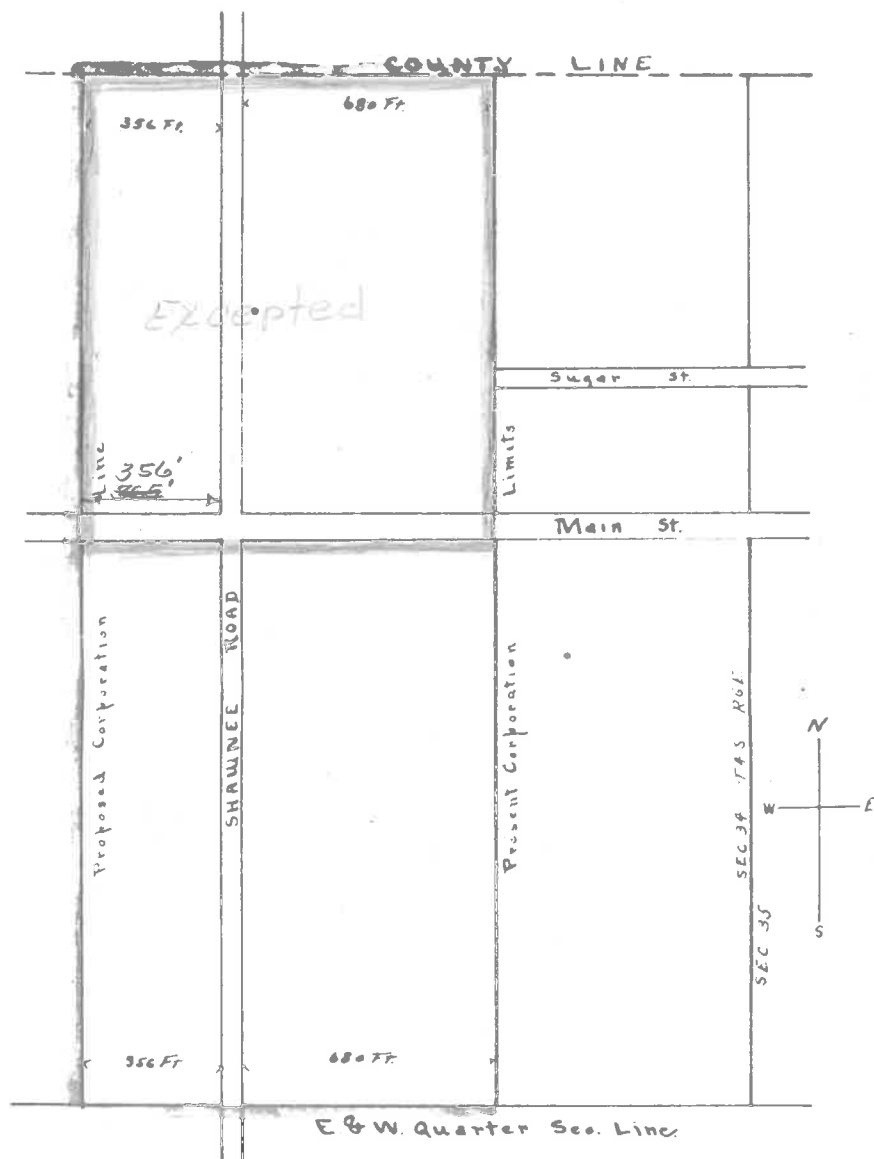


CRIDERSVILLE.

Petition for the annexation of Territory:

To the Commissioners of Auglaize County, Ohio.

The Incorporated Village of Cridersville, Auglaize County, Ohio, hereby petition your Honorable Body for the annexation of the territory hereinafter described, to said village, and, respectively represent,

First: That by an Ordinance duly passed by the Council of said village, on the 17th day of August 1901, and duly published, as provided by law, the territory described as follows was authorized to be annexed thereto, to wit:

Beginning at a point on the county line at the north west corner of the present corporate limits of said village, running thence west on said county line to a point three hundred fifty six (356) feet west of the west line of what is known as the Shawnee road, running thence South parallel with said Shawnee road to a point on the half section line three hundred and fifty six (356) feet west of the West line of said Shawnee road; thence East along said half section line to the south west corner of the present corporate limits of said village; thence north to the place of beginning. Said tract sought to be annexed containing sixty (60) acres more or less, situate in the North East quarter of Section thirty four (34) town four (4) south, range six (6) east, in Anchorage Township, Auglaize County, Ohio.

Second: That D. A. Hoskins was authorized by said village in said ordinance to prosecute the proceedings necessary to affect said annexation, and that a true copy of said ordinance, authorizing said annexation is hereto attached, marked "Exhibit A."

Third: That the plat accompanying this petition and marked "Territory to be annexed" is an accurate map of said territory.

to the Village of Cridersville, Ohio } Dec. 18, 1901.

Board met. Members present: Henry Hellbusch, Samuel Plummer and C. F. Kellermeyer.

This day the Commissioners met pursuant to an adjournment heretofore had in the above matter and after having viewed said territory proposed for annexation and after having heard the evidence for and against said annexation, and having heard the arguments of counsel thereon, and being fully advised in the premises, said Commissioners do find that the said Petition filed herein contains all the matter required by law to be therein contained: that its statements are true: that the map accompanying the petition is accurate: that a notice of the time and place of hearing of said Petition, containing all the substance

thereof was published in the *Di-County Review*, a newspaper printed and of general circulation in said village, for six consecutive weeks subsequent to the filing thereof with the County Auditor, and that a copy of said notice was posted in a conspicuous place within the limits of the territory proposed to be annexed, for six weeks prior to the time fixed for such hearing. The said Board further finds that all necessary ordinances and resolutions have been passed by the council of said village of Windsorville, Ohio, providing for the said annexation, and that said annex is this day legally and properly before the Commissioners for determination. The Board further finds that it is right and proper that a part of the territory described in the petition herein filed by said village be annexed to said village, and that it is right and proper that the petition of said village be granted as to that part of the territory herein described. It is therefore ordered and directed that the following described territory be annexed to and become a part of the incorporated village of Windsorville, Ohio, to wit:

Beginning at a point on the county line at the north west corner of the present corporate limits of said village, and running thence South on said County line to a point three hundred and fifty six (356) feet west of the west line of what is known as the Fairview road; running thence South parallel with said Fairview road to a point on the south line of the public road extending west from Main Street in said village; running thence east along the south line of the public highway to the west line of the present corporate limits of said village; thence South on said west line of the present corporate limits to the place of beginning. It is further ordered that a certified transcript, signed by a majority of this board, of all the orders and proceedings of this Board in relation to the annexation so at once transmitted to the County Recorder, together with said petition, map, and all other papers or files relating to said matter.
