AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE APPLICATION FOR ANNEXATION OF 1.017 ACRES WHICH IS PART OF OUTLOT MO. 1 OF WILLIAM MENKE'S ISUBDIVISION OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 35 JACKSON TOWNSHIP, AUGIAIZE COUNTY, OHIO TO THE VILLAGE OF MINSTER, OHIO.

Whereas, a petition for annexation of certain territory in Jackson

Township was duly filed with the Board of County Commissioners on November

8. 1974.

Whereas, the said petition was considered by the Board of County Commissioners of Auglaize County, Ohio on January 7, 1975.

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners certified the transcript of the proceedings in connection with said annexation with the map and petition required in connection therewith to the Village Clerk who received the same on January 21, 1975.


