## ORDINANCE NO. 1387

TO AUTHORISE THE ABBEKATION OF CERTAIN TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF ST. MARYS, ONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF ST. MARYS, ONLO

SECTION 1. That the annexation of the territory known as the Quinby Addition, and being more perticularly described as follows:

Situated in the Southeast Quarter of Section Four (4), Town Six (6) South, Range Four (4) East, St. Marys Township, Anglaize County, Ohios Beginning at a point on the south line of the St. Marys-Celina Road, said point being marked by an iron stake and being the intersection of the south line of the St. Marys-Jelina Road and the west line of the Hillsdale Addition to the City of St. Marys and being also the north-east corner of a tract of land heretofore conveyed to Edsell Quinby and recorded in Volume 127, page 36, of the Deed Records of Auglaize County, Onio; the noe N 890 30' West a distance of 104.28 feet along the south line of the said St. Marys-Celina Road to a point; thence North 780 56' West a distance of 56.54 feet along the south line of the said St. Marys-Colina Read to a point; thence South 10 15' West, parallel to the east line of the tract heretofore serveyed to Edeell Quinby, a distance of 260-46 feet to an iron pipe; thence North 880 45' West a distance of 120.0 feet to an iron pipe; thence South 10 15' West a distance of 387.64 feet to a point; the mos South 890 30' East, along the present accepted south lime of the aforesaid Quinby tract, a distance of 280.0 feet to a corner post on the east line of the said Quinby tract, said post being also on the west line of the Hillsdale Addition; thence North 10 15' Rest, along the east line of said Quinby tract, a distance of 836.18 feet to the place of beginning, containing 3.41 scres of land, more or less.

SECTION 2. That the Seliciter for the City of St. Marys, Chio, be, and he is, hereby authorised to presecute the preceedings necessary to effect such annexation.

SECTION S. That this ordinance shall take effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
