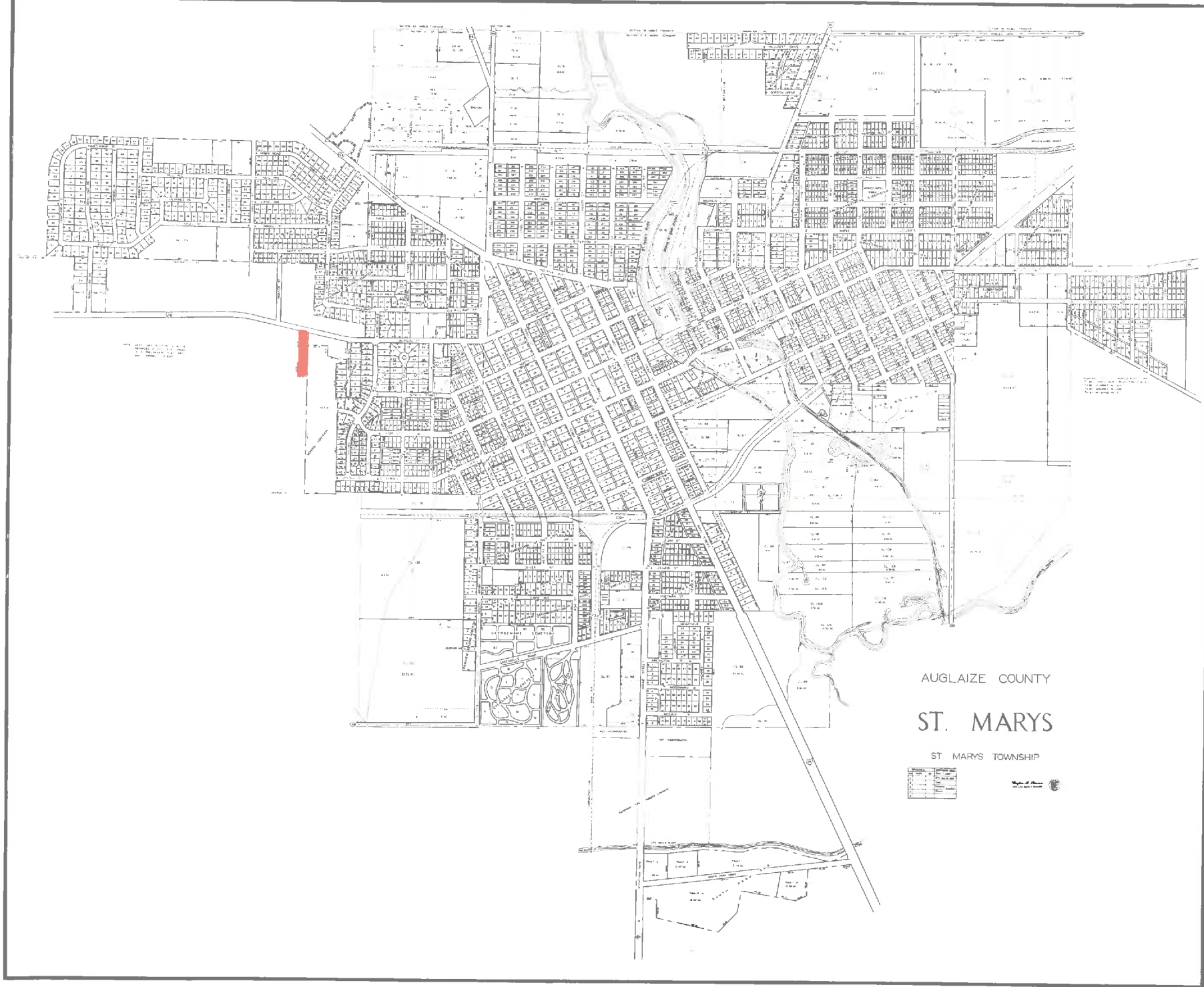

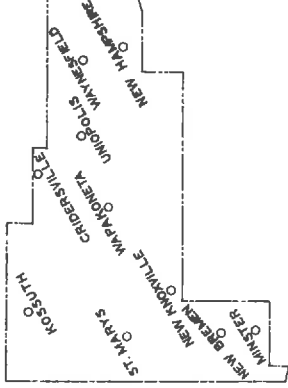

Increase Labelled Temporary To Raise Needed Funds To Meet "Expansion" Debt Requirements

St. Marys city electric rates will be upped effective with the October billing, payable in November. The city council passed an emergency ordinance last night, setting up the new rates for electric current starting with current used in September. At the same time a new electric space heating rate was set to attract more space heating customers.

The new ordinance is referred to as a temporary measure to insure sufficient funds to meet the city's requirement for paying off bonded indebtedness incurred in the city power plant expansion. We are obligated now to pay 30 percent of our gross income for discharge of indebtedness," Safety-service director Kenneth Hegemann told councilmen. In recommending the payment of the debt in 10 years, the consulting engineers had anticipated greater electric consumption and lower production costs. Mr. Hegemann said the expansion took a year longer than anticipated and consequently the city's anticipated operating revenue through increased efficiency was reduced.

The director said the revised rates will cost some residential consumers about 88 cents to \$1

needed to meet the city's debt obligation. He asked councilmen to pass the ordinance as to an emergency effective with the October billing to safeguard the city's financial position. He anticipates the revised rates will bring in about \$2,200 more monthly.

The present residential rate was enacted Nov. 12, 1966 and the present commercial rate Oct. 23, 1967.

The council passed Ordinance 2218, granting a five percent increase in wages to all employees and Ordinance 2220, fixing the salary of the assistant chief engineer at the city power plant. Both had been read previously.

Ordinance 2221 was passed as an emergency, accepting anticipation of property owned by Chester Danneberg to the City of St. Marys. The property involved is that occupied by the S. & W. Motel.

No action was taken on the West Ohio Gas rate ordinance when it was brought up for another reading by the council. It had been read at an earlier meeting.
