

Ordinance no. 910

To Narrow Fire Alley from Anglaize Street to the River

Whereas, on the 17th day of April, 1912, a petition signed by persons owning lots in the immediate vicinity of Fire Alley in the City of Wapakoneta, Ohio extending from Anglaize Street to the Anglaize River, was duly presented to the Council praying that said Alley may be narrowed between the points named by the vacation of a strip of land two (2) feet four and one-half ($4\frac{1}{2}$) inches wide off of the west side thereof; and notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been given as required by law, by publication in the Daily News, a newspaper published and of general circulation in said municipality, for six (6) consecutive week ending May 30, 1912; and Whereas the Council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such narrowing and vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and that it should be made, now therefore

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Wapakoneta, State of Ohio, as follows:

Sec. 1 That Fire Alley (formerly known as River Alley) in said City of Wapakoneta, Ohio, from Anglaize Street north to Anglaize River be and the same is hereby narrowed by the vacation of a strip of land 2 feet $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide off of the west side thereof in accordance with the plat and survey of said Fire Alley and certain lots in the vicinity thereof accepted and approved by the Council by Ordinance No. 909.

Sec. 2 That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest day allowed by law.
