ORDINANCE 2002-25

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE A CERTAIN ALLEY WITHIN THE CITY OF WAPAKONETA, OHIO

WHEREAS, a petition and fees were received by the City of Wapakoneta for vacation of a certain alley within the City, and

WHEREAS, the petition was reviewed by Streets & Alleys Committee of the Wapakoneta City Council and was recommended for vacation.

WHEREAS, the Wapakoneta City Council held a public hearing on this alley vacation on April 3, 2002, at 7:15 p.m.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Wapakoneta, State of Ohio, County of Auglaize, to wit:

SECTION ONE

THAT vacation of the entire alley is described as follows:

1. Being of an alley 16.5 feet wide and lying between Pearl Street and Mechanic Street, Blackhoof Street and Logan Street. Beginning on the north right of way line of Pearl Street and extending north and adjacent east of Loy #263, to the south right of way line of an east/west alley.

SECTION TWO

THAT this alley is hereby vacated with the City of Wapakoneta retaining all rights of ingress and egress and shall maintain a utility easement across and thru the above described property for existing utilities or any utilities deemed necessary for installation in the future, and vacated area shall not have any obstructions on it, such as fences, trees, landscaping, buildings, gardens, or etc.

SECTION THREE

THAT this Ordinance shall be in force from and take effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
