AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PUBLIC ALLEY IN THE CITY OF WAPAKONETA, OHIO, AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, a petition by persons owning a lot in the immediate vicinity of a certain public alley, running east and west and immediately north and adjacent to Inlots No. Five Hundred Nineteen (519) to Five Hundred Twenty five (525), inclusive, and extending from Water Street to the right-of-way of the B. & O. Railroad was duly presented to Council praying that said alley be vacated, and;

Whereas, notice of the pendency and prayer of said: petition has been given as required by law, and;

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is a good cause for the vacation as prayed for, and that it will not be determental to the general interest, and ought to be made, now therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Wapak-oneta, County of Auglaize and State of Ohio, to-wit:

Section 1. That a certain alley running east and west and immediately north and adjacent to Inlots Numbered Five Hundred Nineteen (519) to Five Hundred Twenty-five (525), inclusive, and extending from Water Street to the right-of-way of the B. & O. Railroad in the City of Wapakoneta, Ohio, shall be vacated.
