

Ordinance No. 1734

Passed December 6, 1950

TO VACATE CERTAIN ALLEYS NORTH AND EAST OF
THE WAPAKONETA MACHINE COMPANY

Whereas, on the 2nd day of August, 1950, a petition by persons owning lots in the immediate vicinity of certain alleys north and east of the Wapakoneta Machine Company, was duly presented to council, praying that certain alleys be vacated; and notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been given as required by law, by publication in the Wapakoneta Daily News, a newspaper of general circulation in the corporation, for six consecutive weeks ending October 4th 1950; and,

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and ought to be made, now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Wapakoneta, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That a certain alley 18 feet of uniform width off the east side of Lot 523 in said city, extending from North Street to an alley immediately north of said Lot 523, be, and the same hereby is vacated.

SECTION 2. That a certain alley 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet wide between Lots 521 and 522 in said city, extending from North Street to an alley north of said Lots be, and the same hereby is vacated.

SECTION 3. That a certain alley 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet wide extending from the B. & O. right of way along the north line of Lot 525, the north end of Walkup Street (heretofore vacated) and the north line of Lots 524, 523, and 522, to a point in said alley 166.5 feet west of the west line of Water Street be, and the same hereby is vacated.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
