Ordinance No. 946.

To Narrow Part of Rauth Street.

WHEREAS, on the fifth day of August, 1914, a petition by persons owning lots in the immediate vicinity of Rauth street in the City of Wapakoneta, Ohio, was duly presented to the City Council praying that said street be narrowed by the vacation off the south side thereof of a strip sixteen and one-half feet wide extending from the east line of Seltzer street east to the west line of Lot No. 656; and

WHEREAS, there has been filed with the Council the written consent to such narrowing and vacation by all the owners of the lots and lands abutting on that part of Rauth street proposed to be narrowed; and

WHEREAS, the council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for the narrowing of said street as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and ought to be made, now therefore,

BE IT ORDERED BY THE COUNCIL of the City of Wapakoneta, State of Ohio, as follows:

Section 1.--That Rauth street in said City of Wapakoneta, Ohio, be narrowed by the vacation of a strip off of the south side thereof sixteen and one-half feet wide (that is 16 1/2 feet north and south) extending from the east line of Seltzer street east to the east line of lot No. 4 of Outlot No. 44 extended north or rather to the west line of lot No. 656, and said strip be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2.--That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest day allowed by law.
