

Ordinance No 68.

Vacating Koller Alley.

Section I Be it ordained by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Napakimuta, Ohio that, Whereas Charles Koller and others, on the 17th day of January A.D. 1876, presented a petition praying for the vacation of the following described alley in said Village to wit: Known as Koller's alley, running from Water Street east, along the North side of m. lots No. 516-517- and 518 to the Auglaize River; and, whereas the Council is satisfied that due notice of the filing and pendency of said petition has been given in accordance with the Statute in such case made and provided; and said Council being further satisfied that there is good cause for the vacation of said alley, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and that the same should be made, therefore be it ordained by the Council aforesaid, that said alley be and the same is hereby vacated.

Section II This ordinance passed March 20th 1876, and to take effect on and after ten days after its publication according to law.
