Even with all the housing in that area we have never had an application for a flood certification. I'm using the St. Marys River Study that shows the 100-year flood being 898.4. ODOT's 40 year old plans for the bridge shows the 25-year flood elevation at 897.5 which does not seem unreasonable.

Let's use the 898.4 and I'll place a copy of this transmittal in the FEMA file in case we get another request in the future.

We have no bench mark on that structure but there is one on the bridge on Southland just to the east of SR# 66; tablet on the NE wingwall is 899.34.
