

Town of Amanda situate in the County of Allen and State of Ohio is laid off upon the east Fraction of the North East Quarter of Section Twenty two of Township four South in Range five East on the east bank of the Auglaize River, upon a Variation of Four degrees and ten minutes to the west of magnetic North. All the lots are six poles long, and three poles wide, except the Lots numbered eighty-one to ninety-two, on the west side of water street which are each seven poles long by three poles wide. Division, Jackson, and Adams streets are each three poles in width and the rest are each four poles wide, all the alleys are one pole each the square marked public ground is set apart for public purposes, and the ground between water street and the River north of public street is left out for a common. 153

On this thirtieth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one. Samuel Washburn the proprietor of the town of Amanda personally came before me one of the justices of the peace within and for said County and being sworn saith that he has had a town laid off of which the within is a correct plat. And that he hereby authorizes the same to be Recorded according to the provisions intent and meaning of the act to provide for the recording of town plats. Also came Dye Sunderland and being sworn saith that he has permitted the North half of Division Street in said town: to wit one and a half rods wide the whole length of said street to be laid out on his ground and give so much ground for a road as may lie within a line drawn from the West end of the North side of said Division Street to the ford on the River by the Spring branch and that he is willing the same should be recorded.
