


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Incorporated Village

To the Hon. the Board of Commissioners of the County of Licking and Muskingum and State of Ohio; To the undersigned Citizens residing in the town of Lickingville, a village, County of Licking, a Plat of which said town has been duly acknowledged and recorded, and which territory is not adjoining any City or Incorporated Village do we respectfully ask again Hon. body to organize the following described territory into an Incorporated Village town, commencing at the County line between the Counties of Clinton and Licking, at the North West corner of Section thirty six (36) and running South one half mile, thence East one half mile, thence North one half mile to the County line, thence West along said County line one half mile, to the place of beginning, containing the North West Quarter of said Section thirty six (36) from River (R.) South Range sixth East; The supposed number of inhabitants residing within said description are three hundred, they desire to form a Municipal Corporation, established: The following persons are authorized to act for and on behalf of us as petitioners and agents in the premises. P. D. Marshall, & C. F. Murdoch. We pray that your Hon. body may take such proceedings as are authorized by law, to perfect the organization of the Corporation we are praying for.

In the Matter of the
incorporation of the
Town of Cinderville, Ohio

Sept 10th 1869

This day came A. A. Murdock and R. D. Marshall
the duly authorized agents, and filed a petition, signed by forty-six
persons, with a plat of the territory proposed to be incorporated, in
said Village of Cinderville, which said petition and plat, were ordered
to be filed in the Auditor's Office of this County to be there kept sub-
ject to the inspection of any person or persons interested in said
corporation. It is hereby determined and ordered that said petition be
set for hearing on Thursday the 9th day of December A.D. 1869, at 9 o'clock A.M. The said Agents are ordered to have notice of the
hearing of said petition published according to law; And after-
wards to wit, On the 11th day of December A.D. 1869 the following proce-
dures were had, viz: In the matter of the incorporation of the Town of
Cinderville Ohio, This matter came on to be heard upon the petition and
map of the territory proposed to be included in said Corporation and
ordinance, and the Commissioners do that the petition contains all the in-
formation required by law, and that its statements are true, and that the
name proposed for such corporation is appropriate, that the limits thereof
have been accurately described, and that the same are not unreasonably
large or small, and that the map or plat thereof is accurately made, that
the persons whose names are subscribed thereto are legal voters residing
on said territory, and are satisfied that the notice heretofore issued
and required by law, has been given by the said Agents, and that
there is the requisite population for such corporation. It is therefore
ordered, by the Commissioners, that the prayer of said petitioners be granted,
and that the corporation as named ^{and} marked for in said petition be organized,
and it is further ordered that a full and complete transcript of all the
proceedings be made, sent and signed and delivered, together with the
petition and map, and all other papers on file, to the Recorder of the
County.
