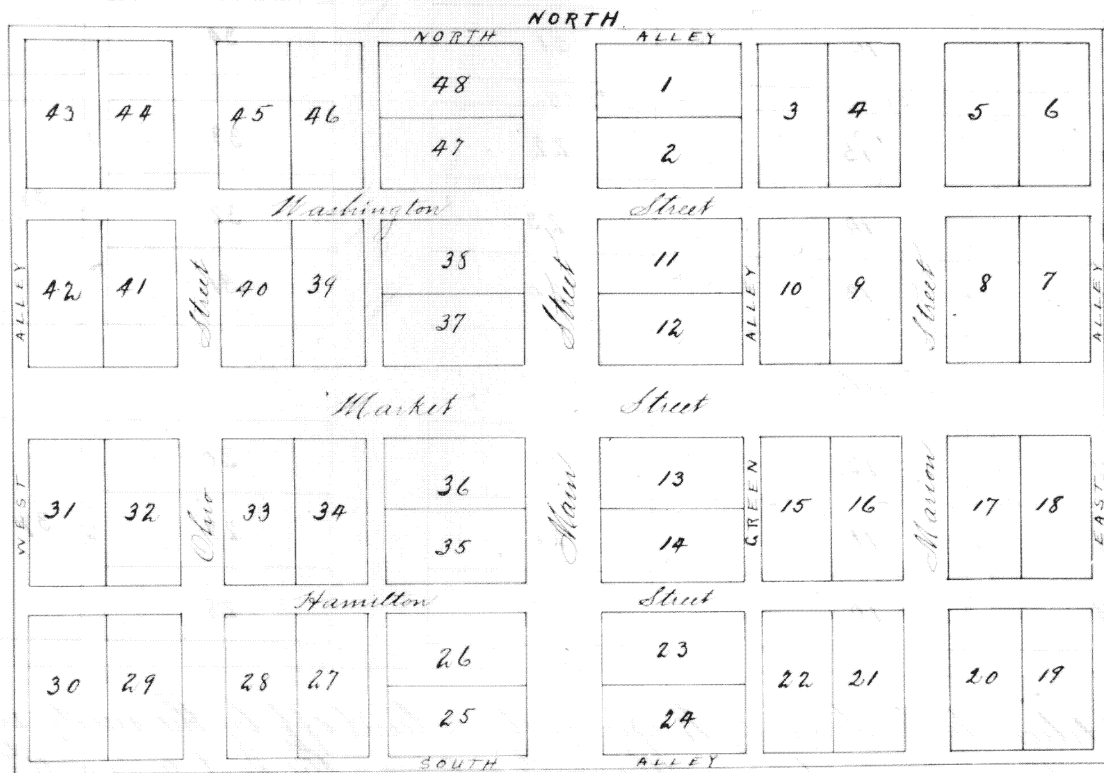


Town of New Hampshire.

New Hampshire is laid off on the North end of the West half of the North West quarter of Section four, township six south of range eight east. The lots are all four rods wide and eight rods long. The streets and alleys all cross each other at right angles running with the cardinal points. Main and Market streets are each four rods wide, Ohio and Marion streets are each three rods wide, and Washington and Hamilton streets are each two rods wide. The alleys are each one rod wide. A monument is placed at the south west corner of Lot No. 12.

 of the same to be his act and deed for the use and purposes therein set forth and
