Town of St. Marys in Section three, township six south range four east. This town is laid out upon a variation of thirty degrees west of north according to the magnetic variation, containing sixty eight lots as numbered on the plat. The lots between Front Street and Main Street from number one to twenty four inclusive are five poles square. The lots numbered 27, 30, 31, 32 are 5 poles long and 8 wide and all other lots numbered on said plat are 5 poles wide and 10 poles long. Main & Wayne streets are each 5 poles wide. Court Street is 45 feet wide. Wharf Street is 100 feet wide and all other streets are four poles. The alleys are all 18 feet wide. The large lot not numbered is 10 poles wide and 20 poles & 12 ft. long and is given as a donation to the County for the purpose of erecting thereon county buildings &c. should the Seat of Justice of the county of Mercer be located in said town. The two lots shaded yellow adjoining South & Perry and North & Perry streets are each 5 poles wide and 10 poles long and are set apart and donated by the proprietors to any regular organized society of professing Christians that may erect thereon suitable churches. We the undersigned proprietors do hereby certify that the above is a correct plat & description of the said town of St. Marys, Mercer County, Ohio prepared by us for record. Given under our hands and seals this 8th day of August 1823. Charles Murray (real) William A. Houston (real), John M. Corkle (real).

The State of Ohio, Darke County, ss. - Before me the undersigned a Justice of the Peace in and for said county personally appeared the within named John M. Corkle, Charles Murray and William A. Houston who severally acknowledged the signing and sealing of the within certificate of the plat and description of the Town of St. Marys and desire that the same may be entered on the records of the county of Darke to which the county of Mercer is at this time attached.
