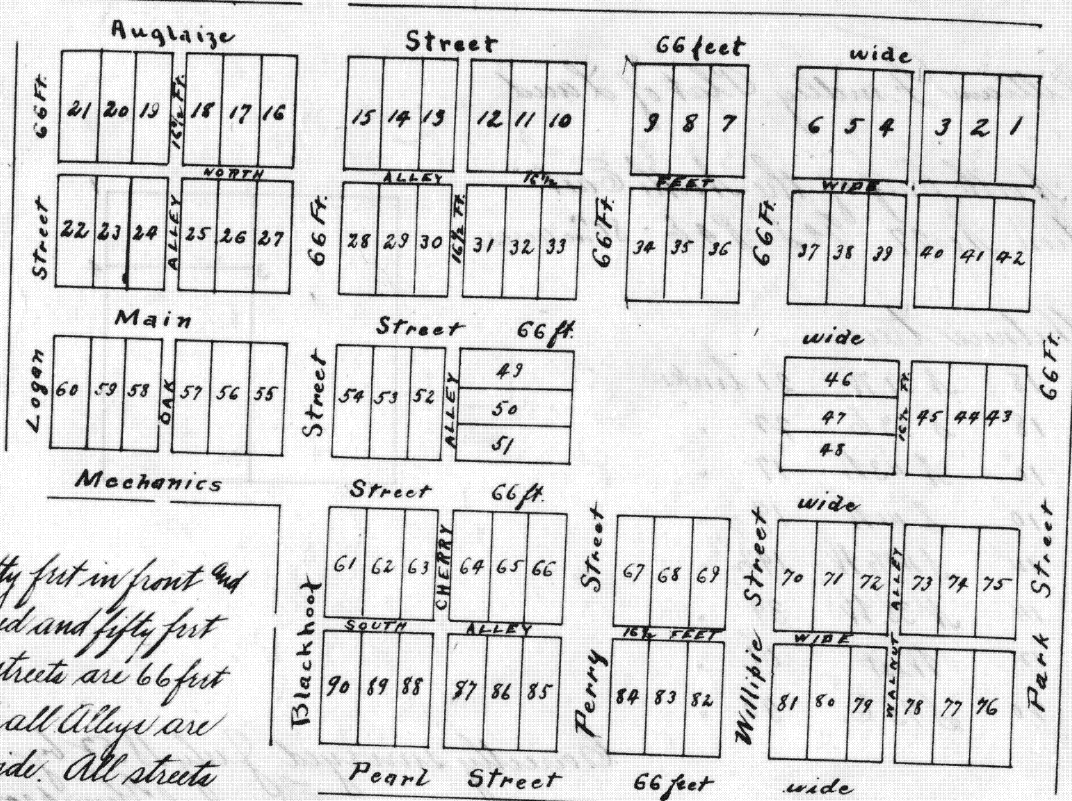


Wapakoneta - Original.



Note:
All is fifty feet in front and one hundred and fifty feet back. All streets are 66 feet wide and all alleys are 16 1/2 feet wide. All streets and alleys cross each other at right angles.

I hereby certify the above to be a true and correct plat of the town of Wapakoneta. Surveyed for J. B. Grant, Peter Aughinbaugh, J. K. Wilds, Joseph Barnett, January 22^d 1833. John Jackson C. S. A. C.

Wapakoneta is laid out on part of Section twenty nine and thirty two, in Township number five south of range number six east, beginning at a stone at the north east corner of the public square. The Public Square is two hundred and eighty two feet square including the streets. All streets are 66 feet wide and all alleys are 16 1/2 feet wide. All streets and alleys cross at right angles. All lots are fifty feet fronting on the streets and one hundred and fifty feet back to the alleys. Blackhoof street runs to the river. The proprietors donate all streets and alleys for public highway and Lots 59 and 60 for a Meeting House and School House. January 25th A.D. 1833.

Wapakoneta laid out by them on the 23d. day of January 1833, situated in the County of Allen, State of Ohio.
