Town of Knoxville, as laid out by James K. Lytle, Proprietor.

Scale of lots: 16 rods to the inch.

Scale of Streets and Alleys: 8 rods to the inch.



The town of Knoxville is laid off in a piece of land embracing the corner of section No. twenty-nine & thirty, town six south, range five east, on the north side of the section. The lots are all 66 feet wide and 137 feet deep: the streets and alleys all cross each other at right angles and run with the cardinal points. A monument is planted at the South east corner of Lot No. One. Main street & Bremen street are each four rods wide: the others are three rods wide: the alleys are one rod wide. Lot No. Seven is donated for the purpose of building a School House.
