I, Robert Grant, Surveyor of said county hereby certify that I have carefully examined said plat of Stallows town and find it carefully executed, and in the Piqua land district in the county of Mercer, and located on the South East quarter of Section No. twenty six in Township No. seven south of range four east.

South East quarter Sect. 27 T7S. R4E.

North East quarter Sect. 34. T7S. R4E.

North West quarter Sect. 35. T7S. R4E.

containing six hundred and forty acres, containing Streets No. and designated as per plat, and Lots No. one hundred and forty four and agreeable to the Statute made and provided. Corner stones are planted in the center of said town on the north east corner of Lot thirty six, South east corner Lot thirty seven, South east corner of Lot No. one hundred and eight and the north corner of lot No. one hundred and nine.

Description of Minister.

Minister is laid out on the South West quarter of Section 26, the South East quarter of Section 27, the North East quarter of Section 34 and the North West quarter of Section 35, Town 7 South, Range 4 east in the County of Mercer. This town by agreement of German Company, by whom the same was purchased was divided into 144 shares each share extending east and west from Main street to the boundary of the town thereof an equal $\frac{1}{2}$ part of each share marked B C D E F G H I K. The town is laid off into 60 squares. The four center ones contain each 18 lots exclusive of those given to public uses and heretofore described. The other squares are intended to be laid off into 24 lots each with a 16 foot alley running north and south through the center of the square. That part of the town between Zweibrucken and Dweitzer streets has been fully laid out into lots in pursuance of the above plan. The corners of lots have also been set on the east side of Dweitzer and the west side of Zweibrucken streets. The remainder of the town is laid off into squares and the lines through those squares serve only to show the squares extending back from Main street and the letters mark the lots and intended lots in each square. The lots are $214\frac{1}{2}$ feet long and $68\frac{1}{2}$ feet wide and $345\frac{1}{2}$ feet long. The public lots are as follows: the one marked A. Catholic Church, Lot B. Catholic School House, C. Protestant Church, Lot D. Protestant School House, Lot E. Market place, Lot F. Court House, Lot G. Town Hall. These public lots are each 60 feet by $181\frac{1}{2}$ feet, except the Market place which is 60 by $362\frac{1}{2}$ feet. These lots are bounded on two sides by the following streets marked thus: 1st. Clay street, 2d. Washington, 3d. Jackson street, 4th. Jefferson street, 5th. Monroe street, 6th. Madison street, 7th. Roman street, 8th. Adams street, and those streets are each 50 feet. The width of the other streets, alleys and squares will be found marked in feet on the plat: the center of Main street at the north and south end thereof is four links east of the quarter section corner. The line between Section 26 and 35 and 27 and thirty four is $1\frac{1}{2}$ feet south of the center of Fourth Street. Stones have been planted at the North East corner of Share No. 72, the north west corner of Share No. 73, at the North East corner of Share No. 36, also at the north west corner of lot of Market place and South west corner of Catholic Church lot. The north and south streets are laid out on a variation of $3^{\circ} 45'$ east and W. Streets $4^{\circ} 05'$. Ohio and Perry streets however vary a little from that variation, all of which is hereby certified to be correct.
