

Annexation of the Incorporated Village of New Bremen and Ober Bremen.

Transcript of all the ordinances, abstracts of returns of the votes and other papers, and proceedings in the matter of annexation of the incorporated village of Ober Bremen to the incorporated village of New Bremen, Auglaize County, Ohio.

The following is a copy of the proceedings of the Council of the incorporated village of New Bremen, Ohio, to wit:

On the 7th day of Sept. 1875 an ordinance was passed by the council of the incorporated village of New Bremen, Ohio, as follows: to wit:

No. 1. An ordinance relative to submitting the question of the annexation of the incorporated village of Ober Bremen to the incorporated village of New Bremen to the qualified electors of said last named village.

Sect. I. Be it ordained by the Council of the incorporated village of New Bremen, Auglaize County, Ohio, that the question "Shall said village of Ober Bremen be annexed to the incorporated village of New Bremen, Auglaize County, Ohio?" shall be submitted to the qualified electors of said village of New Bremen at the general election to be held therein on the 2^d Tuesday of October 1875, being the 12th day of said month. Notice thereof shall be given by publication in the Auglaize County Democrat, for at least twenty (20) days prior to the time of holding said election, and also by posting up at least six (6) posters in six (6) of the most conspicuous places in said village for said period of twenty days prior to said election.

Sect. II. That the Judges and Clerks of said election shall be the same and elected in the same manner as for the election of officers for said village. The electors voting at said election in favor of said annexation shall place upon their ballots the words "For Annexation", and those voting thereat against annexation shall place upon their ballots the words "Against Annexation": that the poll books and tally sheets of said election shall be signed, attested and deposited as in case of election of officers of said village.

Sect. III. This ordinance to take effect and be in force on and after ten days after its first publication according to law. Passed September 17th 1875.

On the 20th day of September 1875 notice of election was duly given to the qualified electors of the incorporated village of New Bremen, Ohio, as follows: The qualified electors of the incorporated village of New Bremen, Ohio, are hereby notified to meet at the usual place of holding elections in said village on Tuesday the 12th day of October 1875 and then and there between the hours of 6 o'clock A.M. and six o'clock P.M. proceed to vote upon the question "Shall the incorporated village of Ober Bremen, Ohio be annexed to the incorporated village of New Bremen, Ohio?" All voters in favor of said annexation will place upon their ballots the words "For Annexation" and those opposed to the same will place

An Ordinance

Approving and confirming the report of the Commissioners arranging the terms and conditions of the annexation of the incorporated village of Ober Bremen to the incorporated village of New Bremen.

Preamble: Whereas on the 20th day of November AD 1875 Jacob Botsel, J. Vogelsang and C. Schmidt heretofore appointed by a resolution of this council as commissioners to act in conjunction with an equal number of persons appointed by the council of the incorporated village of Ober Bremen, to arrange the terms and conditions of the annexation of the incorporated village of Ober Bremen to the incorporated village of New Bremen, made their report in writing in words and figures following, to wit:

To the Hon. Mayor and Council of the incorporated village of New Bremen, Ohio. The undersigned Commissioners appointed by your Honorable Body to act in conjunction with an equal number of Commissioners appointed by the Council of Ober Bremen for the purpose of arranging the terms and conditions upon which Ober Bremen should be annexed to New Bremen, have performed the duties devolving upon them and beg leave to submit the following as the basis agreed upon:

- 1st The present indebtedness of both the corporations of Ober Bremen and New Bremen whatsoever it may be shall be assumed jointly by both corporations and shall be liquidated out of the common fund.
- 2^d All property of whatever kind at present owned by or belonging to Ober Bremen and New Bremen shall be held and considered as joint property without regard to the value of that owned by each particular corporation.
- 3^d The total tax levy for 1875 for each corporation shall stand and remain as it is, and from and after 1876 the rate of taxation shall be uniform throughout the limits of the corporation. All of which is respectfully submitted.
