



I hereby certify that the above map is a correct representation of Hirsch, Hoffman & Cos Addition to the Village of St. Marys, Auglaize County, Ohio, as surveyed and platted by me during April 1888. It covers 14 1/4 acres off the South East part of Sec. 14, T 6 D R 4 E, lots 73 + 74 of West Addition and lots 26, 27, 28, 29 + 30 of Joseph Burington's subdivision of Union Co. Domains subdivision. The streets are continuations of the same in West Addition. Dimensions are indicated by feet and hundredths. Courses in degrees and minutes. Variation of compasses 2° east.
