

## Annexation proceedings to the Village of Cridersville.

*State of Ohio, Auglaize County, ss.*

Daniel Baker being first duly sworn says that on the seventh day of March AD 1889 at the instance and request of C. A. Layton he posted a notice on the livery barn of Reichelderfer's which barn is on the territory sought to be annexed to the village of Cridersville and in a conspicuous place, of which notice the following is a true copy, to wit:

### Legal Notice

Notice of annexation of territory to the Village of Cridersville, Auglaize County, Ohio: Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern, that on Monday the 4th day of March 1889, the village of Cridersville through its authorized agent C. A. Layton, filed with the Auditor of Auglaize County, a petition praying for the annexation to the corporation of Cridersville, the following contiguous territory, to wit: the east half of the North east quarter of section thirty four (34), town four (4) south, range six (6) east, Auglaize County, Ohio. This petition with plat is now on file for inspection and will be for hearing on the 7th day of May 1889 at 10 o'clock A.M. before the Commissioners of Auglaize County, Ohio.

Resolution No. 121.

Bent resolved by the Council of the incorporated village of Cridersville, O. that we recommend to the Commissioners through our attorney, C. A. Layton, that they cut down the portion of land proposed in Ordinance No. 173 to be annexed to the village of Cridersville, O. to one eighth ( $\frac{1}{8}$ ) of a mile west and one half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of a mile north and south instead of one quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of a mile west as provided for in said ordinance No. 173 passed February 4<sup>th</sup> 1889, and that a copy of this resolution accompany the petition to the Commissioners of Auglaize County, O. as agreed upon by the Council and Ezra D. Long the owner of the greater part of the real estate proposed to be annexed to the village of Cridersville, O. Done at the Council House in Cridersville, O. this 18<sup>th</sup> day of February AD 1889.

Journal Entry of filing petition.

Monday, March 4<sup>th</sup>, 1889. This day came the village of Cridersville by its duly authorized agent C. A. Layton, and filed with the Auditor of Auglaize County, Ohio, a petition (and a plat of certain lands) asking for the annexation of certain territory therein described. The matter having been called to the attention of the Commissioners they set Tuesday the seventh day of May AD 1889, at 10 o'clock A.M. as the day and hour for the hearing of said petition, which said time was communicated to C. A. Layton Agent of said village.

### Petition.

In the matter of the annexation of territory to the Village of Cridersville, Auglaize County, Ohio.

To the Honorable, the County Commissioners of Auglaize County, Ohio.  
 Now comes the village of Cridersville by its duly authorized agent  
 C. A. Layton and represents and says: That the village of Cridersville,  
 Auglaize County, Ohio, is duly incorporated under the laws of Ohio; that  
 on the 4th day of February 1889, an Ordinance was duly passed by the  
 village council authorizing the annexation of the hereinafter described  
 territory and empowering and directing the petitioners herein to pros-  
 ecut[e] all proceedings necessary to effect such annexation (a certified  
 copy of said ordinance and an accurate map or plat of said territory  
 sought to be annexed is filed herewith and made a part hereof under  
 marks of Exhibits A & B) and to which reference is here made. The  
 contiguous territory sought to be added is described as follows: The  
 east half of the north east quarter of Section thirty four (34), town four  
 W. south, range six East, Auglaize County, Ohio. Your petitioner,  
 the Incorporated village of Cridersville, by its duly authorized and  
 appointed agent, C. A. Layton, says that the territory hereinbefore  
 described is annexed to and made a part of the corporation of  
 Cridersville, for corporate purposes. C. A. Layton

#### Ordinance No. 173.

An ordinance relating to and authorizing the enlargement of the incor-  
 porate limits of Cridersville, and annexation of territory thereto.

Sect. I. Be it ordained by the council of the Incorporated village of  
 Cridersville, Auglaize County, Ohio, that the hereinafter named tract  
 or parcel of land contiguous to the present corporation line be annex-  
 ed to said corporation for corporation purposes, and subject to all  
 existing ordinances and all ordinances which may hereafter be in  
 force, and that we authorize the annexation of the same, to wit:  
 the east half of the north east quarter of Section thirty four (34), town  
 four W. south, range six East. Sect. II. Be it further ordained  
 that C. A. Layton be and he hereby is appointed and authorized to  
 prosecute all proceedings to effect such annexation.


Sect. III. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict  
 herewith be and the same are hereby repealed. Sect. IV. That this  
 ordinance be in full force and effect after legal publication thereof.

Journal Entry on annexation of territory to Cridersville, Ohio  
 In the matter of the annexation of } Before the Board of Commissioners  
 territory to the village of Cridersville, Ohio } of Auglaize County, Ohio.

May 7<sup>th</sup> 1889. This day this matter, at 10 o'clock A.M., came on to be heard, all the members of the Board of Commissioners being present. It having been made to appear that the proper notice as required by law had been duly given and a copy of said notice duly posted in a conspicuous place on said territory and affidavit in proof thereof duly made and filed with the papers in this case, and all preliminary steps necessary before a hearing of said matter could be had, having been all duly taken, the Board of Commissioners proceeded to hear said matter. The village of Cridersville was represented by its Agent, C.A. Layton, and Edgar DeLong, an interested person, owner of a portion of the lands sought to be annexed, was present in person opposing the annexation of a portion of said premises; and testimony was heard. The Commissioners thereupon find that the petition contains all the matters required by law to be set out: that the statements are true: that the limits of the proposed addition are not unreasonably large and that the plat is accurate. Thereupon the Commissioners being of the opinion that the prayer of the petition ought to be, to an extent, granted, do order and say that the East half of the premises (being one eighth of a mile east and west and one half a mile north and south) described in said petition be and the same are hereby annexed to and made a part of the corporate limits of the Village of Cridersville. It is further ordered that all orders and proceedings herein shall be entered on the official Journal of said Board and a certified transcript thereof, signed by a majority of said Board, be delivered, together with the petition, map, and all other papers filed relating to the matter, to the Recorder of Auglaize County, Ohio, at the earliest time practicable.
