In the matter of the annexation of contiguous territory to the Village of Wapakoneta, Ohio:- Petition to the Hon. Commissioners of Auglaize County, Ohio.

Gentlemen:


The Incorporated Village of Wapakoneta hereby petitions your honorable body for the annexation of the territory hereinafter described to said Village and respectfully represents; 1- That by an ordinance (No. 488) duly passed by the council of said village on the 9th day of June, 1897, duly published as required by law in the Auglaize County Democrat of the issue of June 17, 1897, and duly recorded in Record of Ordinances of said village Vol. 2, page 161, the territory therein mentioned and accurately described as follows, was authorized to be annexed thereto, viz: The south half of the north-west quarter, the south-east quarter of the south-west quarter, and the east half of the south-west quarter of the south-west quarter, all in section 28, town 5 south, range 6 east. Also, The south-east quarter of the north-east quarter and a strip 5.25 chains wide of the north side of the south-west quarter of the north-east quarter, all in section 29, town 5 south, range 6 east. Also, The south-east quarter of the north-east quarter, and the east half of the south-east quarter, except that part south of the Auglaize River, all in section 30, town 5 south, range 6 east. Also, The south-east quarter of the north-west quarter (except that part thereof lying north and west of the Auglaize River), all in section 31, town 5 south, range 6 east. Also, The south half of section 32, town 5 south, range 6 east. Also, The west half of the west half of the north-west quarter of section 33, town 5 south, range 6 east. 2- That the plat accompanying this petition and marked "Territory to be annexed" is an accurate map of such territory. Dated this 1st day of July, A.D. 1897.

and


Proposed Extension - Shaded Blue





The Board of Commissioners this day met in Regular session members present, J. S. Butcher, Henry Hellbusch, and Samuel Plummer.

In the matter of the petition for the annexation of certain contiguous territory to the Village of Wapakoneta, O.

September 7th 1897. This day came R. B. Anderson as the Agent and solicitor of the Village of Wapakoneta, Ohio, and on behalf of said Village, presented to the Board of County Commissioners a petition, duly signed, for the annexation of certain contiguous territory to the said Village, and also a plat or map of such territory marked "Territory to be annexed" and thereupon said Board caused said petition to be filed in the office of the County Auditor on said 7th day of September 1897. It is therefore now ordered by said Board of County Commissioners that said petition be heard before them at their office in the Court House at Wapakoneta, Ohio, on the 9th day of November 1897, at 10 o'clock A.M.

This being the day set for the hearing in the above named matter and the hour having arrived the Board of Commissioners proceeded with the case. It having been made to appear that the proper notice as required by law, had been duly given and a copy of said notice duly posted in a conspicuous place on said territory and an affidavit in proof thereof duly made and filed with the parties in the case, and all preliminary steps necessary before hearing of said matter could be had having been duly taken, The Village of Wapakoneta was represented by its Agent R. B. Anderson, Thereupon M. E. Haywood, et al, interested persons and owners of a portion of the lands sought to be annexed, filed a remonstrance thereto and were represented by C. A. Layton as Counsel, - and after listening to the arguments of counsel in the case it was moved by Henry Hellbusch, seconded by Samuel Plummer and by a full "aye" vote of the Board to adjourn in said matter until November 18th 1897 at 10 o'clock A.M. and in the meantime view the premises sought to be annexed.

This day the Board proceeded to hear the matter of the annexation of certain contiguous territory to the village of Wapakoneta, Ohio as prayed for in the petition of said village herein, and having heard the arguments and suggestions of the persons appearing for and against the granting of the prayer of said petition, and being fully advised do find that the said petition contains all the matters required by law to be contained therein that its statements are true, that the map accompanying the petition is accurate, that a notice of the time and place of the hearing of said petition, containing the substance thereof, was published in the "Anglaize County Democrat" a newspaper printed and of general circulation in said village and in this County, for six consecutive weeks subsequent to the filing thereof with the County Auditor, and that a copy of said notice was posted in a conspicuous place within the limits of the territory proposed to be annexed for six weeks prior to the time fixed for such hearing, and it further appearing to the Board that it is right and proper that the prayer of said petition be granted, it is now hereby ordered that the territory in said petition described, except that part of the south half of the north west quarter of section 28, Town 5 South, Range 6 East lying north and east of the Anglaize River, and all that part of section 38 Town 5 South Range 6 East described in said petition and all that part of the south east quarter of the north west quarter of Section 34, Town 5 South, Range Six East, that lies west of the present west line of the Anglaize County Fair Grounds, and south of the St. Marys Road; and the south half of the south half of section 32.
